- **SATH (Supporting Adolescents Together To Heal):**

SATH is a structured Adolescent Peer Educators Leadership Programme aimed at promoting emotional well-being, life skills, and responsible decision-making among students. Under the guidance of the School Counsellor, peer educators received national exposure by attending a summit in Delhi and further extended their learning through collaborative sessions with neighbouring schools.

- **Parents Involvement Programme (PIP):**

The Parents Involvement Programme strengthens the school–home partnership by actively involving mothers in the educational ecosystem. Rooted in the values of gender equality and women empowerment, the programme provides a platform for mothers to share skills, nurture their talents, and contribute meaningfully to students’ holistic development.

- **Roti Bank Movement:**

The Roti Bank Movement is a humble, zero-investment initiative aligned with SDG 2 (Zero Hunger). Students bring homemade food weekly, which is collectively distributed by them among the needy, fostering empathy, social responsibility, and the spirit of seva.

- **Blood Donation Drives:**

Through the Eco and Interact Clubs, the school supports PGIMER and Government hospitals by organising blood donation camps and conducting awareness campaigns. Students play an active role by spreading messages through rallies and Nukkad Nataks, promoting voluntary blood donation.

- **Langar Sewa:**

Gurupurab and Children’s Day are observed in a meaningful manner with kirtan followed by langar for all students and staff. The initiative nurtures values of equality, sharing, and community service, allowing students to experience the true essence of seva.

- **Commerce Connection:**

An experiential learning initiative enabling students to apply commerce concepts through real-life business activities, develop entrepreneurial skills, maintain accounts, and contribute profits to the Interact Club, thereby promoting financial literacy and social responsibility.

AKSIPS' CLEAN AND GREEN DREAM

IMPLEMENTATION OF ENVIRONMENT EDUCATION : We follow 'Hands - On Approach'.

Our agenda is to:

1. Practice and teach responsible attitude to conserve the environment.
2. Actively promote the use of biodegradable alternatives for daily life use.
3. Practise various measures to improve the overall energy efficiency on the campus.
4. Practise water efficiency, conservation and storage measures on the campus. Focus on clean water and sanitation.
5. Use of eco-friendly material/products on the campus to improve the overall health of people and surroundings.
6. Incorporate and promote education for sustainable development and climate change issues in (classroom and outdoor) teaching methodology.
7. Promote community-level engagement to create awareness and encourage the community to participate and practise sustainable and holistic education.
8. Continuous monitoring and improvement of the practices to reduce the environmental impacts of the activities and operations.
9. Involve management, teachers, staff and students both boys and girls in implementing green policy.

Our dedicated Eco-Pals and Swachta Club plays an active role to help in implementing environment education.

We inculcate environmental awareness and sensitivity among our students through a plethora of activities.

1. Tree Plantation Drives: In addition to planting within our campus we have adopted the park opposite our school where we plant and nurture trees.

2. Herbarium : Students are taught about beneficial herbs in school herbarium which students tend to also.
3. Saplings of these herbs and amlas from the tree in school are shared with the parents from time to time.
4. Students are taught about waste segregation and its benefits. They use the Green and Blue bins to put wet and dry waste respectively. We have a compost pit in our school where children are taught how to put biodegradable waste for generating manure.
5. Cleanliness Drives: Students clean their school campus periodically and they also cleaned the area surrounding the school and the park outside as part of Swachata Hi Sewa Hai on Gandhi Jayanti.
6. They are taught to make decorative and new useful articles out of waste to encourage recycling, reusing and reducing waste. They enjoy Best Out of Waste Activities. Students made paper bags out of newspaper and waste paper and distributed them to the vendors in the neighbouring market to spread the message of Say No to Plastic Bags and awareness of Recycle, Reuse and Reduce.
7. They are encouraged to bring cloth napkins and avoid foil and single use plastic.
8. They are encouraged to switch off lights and fans when not in use, turn off taps tightly and throw garbage in proper bins.
9. They are made aware about the dangers of stagnant water and steps to keep their surroundings dry to avoid breeding of dengue and malaria spreading mosquitoes. Our students went on a Community Education Drive where they told the residents of the surrounding area about the dangers of stagnant water and steps to avoid water stagnation.
10. Students are made aware to celebrate festivals in an eco- eco-friendly way- Not use chemical based holi colours, avoid playing wet Holi, celebrate cracker free Diwali or use green crackers. Gift green plants, wrap gifts in cloth bags or recycled papers, use earthen diyas, use leaf plates and earthen kulhads as disposable items.
11. They are encouraged to take cloth bags for shopping.
12. Walk or cycle, use public transport or do car pooling.
13. Students present Nuddak Nataks to create awareness about environment sensitive issues amongst the community from time to time.
14. We have healthy tiffin competition, healthy snack making activity, healthy drink making activity, home state dish making activity to encourage healthy eating and promote awareness of delicious traditional Indian dishes.
15. Parents as well as experts are invited to talk about how to look after our environment and ourselves.
16. Our students and teachers also participated in a cycle rally at the lake as part of promoting fitness and use of eco- friendly vehicles to reduce pollution.
17. Excursions and trips We take students on several trips to provide them real life experience and understand and appreciate our environment. Nature Walk to the fragrance garden , Visit to Chhatbir Zoo, Bird Park, Botanical Garden, Kansal Wildlife Sanctuary, Science City at Kapurthala, trip to Dharamshala and Maklotganj.
18. Girl students are encouraged to use Sanitary Pads. Our school also has a sanitary pad dispensing machine in case of an emergency and Incinerator for safe disposal of used Sanitary Napkins.

The Orientation Programme is organised at the beginning of each session to welcome and acquaint the parents with the school's vision, policies, procedures, expectations, holistic learning programme, parental involvement, curriculum and assessment pattern, management, faculty and staff.

Parent participation and engagement is welcomed as resource persons. Many parents come and engage with the students, share their experiences and skills like teaching children to make quick tasty healthy snacks, art and craft, new games, songs, dances, musical instruments. A dentist mother told about oral hygiene, a father in the traffic police told about road safety. Some parents volunteer to help in making props and dressing up students during the annual function.

Activities and functions are organised for the parents like on Mother’s Day healthy tiffin and snack making competition, talent show, best dressed mom activities are organised, on Grandparents’ Day several fun activities involving grandparent - grandchild partnership are organised.

Workshops on parenting like managing troubled teens, children with special needs, bridging parent-child gap , emotional stress issues, health and hygiene issues etc. are also organised.

We also encourage our parents to give back to the society by organising Blood Donation Camps.

Bimonthly PTMs are held enabling parents to discuss their children's progress, share any concerns, clarify doubts and share inputs regarding their children with the teachers and vice versa.
